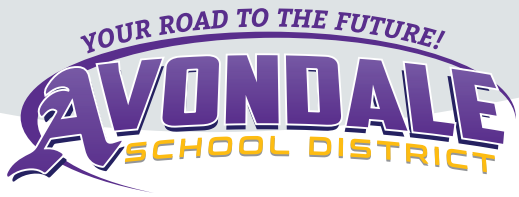

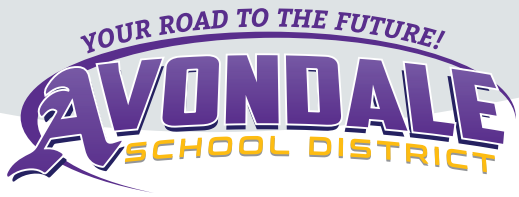
Exploratory Classes

- Art: Two regular #2 pencils and a white eraser, 1 fine point & 1 extra fine point BLACK sharpie, colored pencils
- Advanced Art: See page 3
- Band: All band members must have a copy of *Essential Techniques Book 3* by Tim Lautzenheizer, et al. (Hal Leonard Publishing), *101 Rhythm and Rest Patterns* by Grover Yaus (Belwin Publishing), and *Master Theory Book 2* by Charles Peters & Paul Yoder (Kjos Publishing). All three of these texts may be ordered through the band boosters in the fall or may be purchased ahead of time. Band members will need a folder or binder with paper for taking notes. All students will need to have a pencil every day. Woodwind players need a minimum of 3 playable reeds of strength 3 or higher. Brass players need to have appropriate valve oil and/or slide oil/grease. Trumpet and trombone players will need a straight mute and cup mute. Percussionists must have a stick bag, Timpani mallets (general use required, super staccato suggested in addition), Snare Sticks, Yarn Mallets, and Plastic Mallets. Band members must have an Avondale Bands polo shirt and khaki pants for uniform. Polo shirts can be purchased through the Avondale Band Boosters in the fall. **All band students need their own combination lock.**
- Choir: One binder or folder, notebook specifically for choir notes; pencils.
- French: 2" binder with 5 dividers, pencils
- Math Essentials: 1" 3-ring binder with 2 dividers, loose leaf paper, pens, pencils
- Mustang Connections: Folder with pockets, spiral notebook
- Spanish: One 2" or 3" 3-ring binder, 10 dividers, lined paper, pencils, 1 pack of 4 large dry erase Expo brand markers (will be collected for community use), one pack of 3x5 index cards (will be collected for community use). If you can help provide for our classroom: box of band-aids, container of sanitizing wipes, nut-free candy.

Additional Supplies

All students will need at least 3 jumbo and 2 regular sized book covers. Every 8th grade student should have a pencil case to keep their pencils, pens, highlighters, post-it notes all together and organized. ***Please note:** Supply requests could be adjusted due to staffing changes.

The District will provide all basic supplies needed by the student to complete the required course curriculum. The student and/or his/her family may choose to purchase their own supplies if they desire to have a greater quantity or quality of supplies, or desire to help conserve the limited resources for use by others. The teacher or appropriate administrator may recommend useful supplies for these purposes.



Advanced Art Class Supply List

(entire year-long course with Art Show and Field Trip)

- 2 "Extra-fine" OR "Ultra-fine" Sharpie Markers (black ink)
- 2 "Fine" Sharpie Markers (black ink)
- Several #2 Regular wood pencils (NO mechanical pencils for art, please)
- 1 white eraser
- Pencil case or Box, specific for ART supplies (stored IN art room & carried home for homework)
- One 8.5" x 11" or 9"x 12" Sketch book, prefer 65 lb, (or higher, but NOT watercolor paper) white paper, spiral bound, 80 or more sheets. Hard cover will last longer, but costs more.
- Internet access for image research (at home or elsewhere outside of school) with ability to print and/or store on thumb drive)

Optional (kind of expensive, so use coupons for Michaels or JoAnn's or student discount at an art store):

- Studio Artists colored pencils (NOT RoseArt, Crayola, Sargent, or Faber-Castell; but better art quality with softer lead) We suggest Prismacolor (not veritihin or erasable), at least a set of 12 – the more the better!
- Good quality hand-held pencil sharpener (helps your expensive pencils last longer)
- Own set of synthetic brushes for painting, including brights (flat), rounds, sizes 2-8 or more...
- Own set of drawing pencils (not charcoal) HB, 2B, 6B & ebony (for homework)

In addition to the "privately owned" items above, please plan ahead to expect a **\$25 materials cost reduction** as this class will go through LOTS of expensive art materials. These supplies are not limited to, but include: various pencils, charcoal, oil & chalk pastels, inks, special pens, watercolor papers, paints & brushes, acrylic paints & brushes, tempera paints & brushes, plaster of paris, printmaking blocks, inks & papers, fibers & mixed-media, clays, glazes, under-glazes, wood, cutting tools, metals & wires, adhesives, mat/display boards, etc. Collectively we can afford better quality materials is we are able to buy in bulk and we share rather than extend the list to each student.

ALL STUDENT TEXTBOOK INFORMATION SHEET

The textbooks you have been issued are extremely important to our school and your education. Additionally, they are very expensive to repair or replace. Please take very good care of them this year and follow the do's and don'ts listed below. - Tape your book cover to the inside of the book.

DO:

- Write your name on the next available line inside your book cover in ink. (Print)
- Include 2019-2020 in the space for year.
- You must have all of your books covered by Tuesday, September 3rd.
- You may use stretchable book covers that can be purchased at local area stores, paper covers, or brown paper grocery bag.
- Your teachers will speak more with you about covering your books.
