

POSSIBLE SIGNS OF *Early Giftedness*



Deep Curiosity

Constantly asks questions and wants to understand how and why things work.



Rapid Learning

Picks up new ideas or skills very quickly, often after just one or two exposures.



Exceptional Verbal Skills

Uses rich vocabulary or expresses complex thoughts beyond typical age expectations.



Intense Focus

Becomes completely absorbed in topics or activities of strong personal interest.



Creative Connections

Makes unique links between ideas or sees patterns others might miss.



Uneven Development

May be advanced in some areas but still developing in others (academically, socially, or emotionally).



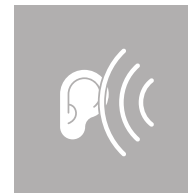
Emotional Intensity

Feels emotions deeply and reacts strongly to experiences or challenges.



Strong Sense of Justice

Shows early awareness of fairness, rules, and empathy for others.



High Sensitivity

Responds intensely to sights, sounds, textures, or emotions in the environment.



Imaginative Problem-Solving

Thinks in original ways and enjoys inventing, creating, or experimenting.

Note for parents: Not every gifted child will display all these characteristics. This list helps families recognize traits often seen in young gifted learners who may thrive in an environment that moves at their pace and supports both their intellectual and emotional growth.



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
